

# From the Pastor's Pen

## Unbinding Your Heart

*“Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven. Again, truly I tell you that if two of you on earth agree about anything they ask for, it will be done for them by my Father in heaven. For where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them.” (Matthew 18)*

Rev. Martha Grace Reece, in her book, “Unbinding Your Heart: 40 Days of Prayer and Faith Sharing,” says: “The heart of evangelism is being in love with God, being part of a church you love, and caring about other people who do not live with this faith. Faith sharing focuses on relationships, not ‘bringing in more young people’ or ‘helping our church to grow again.’ Sharing our faith first with each other and then with others changes our lives and helps us feel even more in touch with God.”

Asking most people to share their faith publicly is like asking them to give a speech in front of a crowd—it’s the stuff of bad dreams, they don’t feel comfortable, they break out in a cold sweat in just the thought of it! Preparation, practice and prayer are tools which make you more comfortable in fulfilling your calling as Jesus’ follower to “Go, make disciples...” Getting more involved in the life of this church in discussion groups, Sunday school, bible studies, fellowship events, service opportunities, committee and leadership roles, and worship will help you to be more comfortable and effective in sharing your faith and sharing the gospel with others.

Rev. Reese’s book is a great resource and guide to help you become Christ’s evangelist. It is part of a series of books and studies I have used in congregational life in the past. One person said: “This book is about breaking the curse, untying the knots that keep us from living exciting lives in the Spirit. It’s about unbinding the Good News that God adores us and everyone else; that God has shown this to us through Jesus Christ.”

I hope you will think and pray about your own words and stories that you are ready to use in sharing your faith. The "don't ask, don't tell" way of discipleship is not the Christian way. Jesus expects you to be ready and willing to share it with others in loving and graceful ways. He has promised that the Holy Spirit will be with you, giving you both the words and the opportunities for respond faithfully in the moment.

I would challenge you to become more comfortably about being in conversation with others about matters of faith such as: what you believe and why; why it matters so much to you; how it's changed you; what difference being a Christian makes in your life. Not being afraid of those kinds of conversations and questions will help you to grow in your faith and deepen your relationship with Christ and each other.

Part of a faithful response to this life in Christ includes sharing this unbelievably good news with others through simple and genuine daily conversation. Your story and your thoughts are of interest to others and they also want opportunities to be asked and heard about their questions and beliefs. We can all be used as an instrument of grace when we take up the challenge of sharing our faith in Christ Jesus.

Rev. Reece said, "If we want people to understand or enter a faith life, we have to figure out ways to share our faith...If our faith is real, if being a Christian makes a deep difference in our own lives, it matters that we be able to talk about that with the people we care about and the people that Christ cares about...God matter more than church. The purpose of evangelism is to help new men, women, and children begin a life of relationship with God."

Preparation, practice and prayer: these tools help you to share your faith. Unbind your heart and become an even more vibrant and engaging follower of Jesus Christ. Be a voice of truth and hope in this world to one another.

## **New GULF BEACH PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH DAY AWAY & RESPITE CARE PROGRAM**

One of the most pervasive things affecting families today is “family caregiving.” Whether someone is dealing with an aging parent, grandparent, or child; their spouse, sibling, or friend—the stress is enormous and they usually do not have any organized means of understanding and preparing for the relentless process that can easily consume large portions of their lives and psyche.

According to the Council on Aging of Panama City, there are no respite care programs in Panama City Beach. Therefore, we at Gulf Beach Presbyterian Church feel called to fill this need as a ministry of our church. We are going to offer a day away program for caregivers and their loved one or charge. **This program will be offered Thursday mornings from 8:30 to 12:00. There will be a caregiver’s support session from 11:15 to 12:00.** The caregiver will have a few hours to spend on themselves and needs they may have. We are in hopes that by providing the support session in conjunction with the last 45 minutes of the program, caregivers will take advantage of the time to meet together and share their own successes and failures.

There will be games, chess, card games, puzzles, adult coloring, reading, or water coloring to assist with the fine motor skills and cognitive stimulation, as well as perhaps just watching a movie and conversing with others. The program team will be made up of a registered nurse and volunteers. This is to ensure your loved one or charge will enjoy a safe yet fun experience.



## Courage Under Fire

### Prophetic witness of the church in the Philippines

Bishop Reuel Norman O Marigza, General Secretary, United Church of Christ in the Philippines (UCCP)

*For while we live, we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be made visible in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you - 2 Corinthians 4:11-12*

This passage of Scripture did not make much impact until I began to be immersed in Philippine realities and consider the implication of such to the prophetic witness and mission the church.

From 2001 to 2010, during the term of the past Philippine president, Gloria Macapagal Arroyo, per 1,000 people were killed extra judicially and more than 20 members of the United Church of Christ in the Philippines (UCCP) became martyrs. Behind these numbers of trumped-up charges, abductions, tortures and extrajudicial killings are human faces, human stories, heroic struggles and much sacrifice. Within President Benigno Aquino's current term, about 318 have joined the list of martyrs.

As the church lives out its calling of proclaiming life in all its fullness, it often runs counter to those in power. And as the church's prophetic voice continues to be raised, it is often met with the ire of the state and those who seek to gain from conditions of injustice, marginalization, social stratification, and deep poverty.

The reality of the empire stares us in the face. It sports a new name, neocolonialism, but spawns the same evils feeding on the hapless states that it gazes on and still supplies the rapacious and greedy empire what it desires: minerals, precious stones and metals, raw materials, and slave labor.

There are those who have resisted, those whose voices have not been silenced. Even at the threat of life and limb, they have taken a daring stand against the might of the empire. They have formed communities of resistance and produced numbers of martyrs whose blood, whose lives, have inspired others to take on the fight.

In our own small way, the UCCP has contributed to communities of resistance as well as martyrdom.



## **My Angel Gabriel William Scott...from *Angels Are for Real***

On Monday, April 28, 2003 we found ourselves at Riley Hospital for Children. We were introduced to a very mild mannered pediatric surgeon, Dr. Daniel Wurtz. He examined Gabe extremely closely, spending a lot of time talking to him about his concerns, carefully moving certain joints in his body, and looking him all over. I recall him asking Gabe why he had so many bruises on his body. I had not paid too much attention to his bruising in the past, figuring he was just an active six year old boy. When the doctor began questioning Gabe, I first thought to myself, "Does he think Gabe is being abused?" The doctor quickly realized the misconception we might be thinking and reassured us that he wasn't concerned about anything like that. I realized the doctor had immediately realized the bruising was due to a low platelet count, symptomatic of cancer of the blood. The doctor requested that we get a number of tests completed that day at the hospital and report back to him later that day. When we returned to his clinic, he told us that he wanted to do some more studying of the tests and some consulting and that he would call us at home later that evening. I took Gabe and Michelle home and decided to get a few hours of work in that day. It was just a few minutes after arriving at work when Michelle had called me. The doctor had called the house and informed Michelle and me that we need to return to Riley's Emergency Department immediately. I rushed home and we drove back to the hospital to be greeted by the Emergency Room personnel waiting on us. It was that night that we were informed that they be believed Gabe had some form of Leukemia; a type of cancer of the blood or bone marrow characterized by an abnormal increase of white blood cells. Over the next two years we were overwhelmed with a number of awesome doctors, nurses, social workers, chaplains, and oncologists who took care of Gabe.

### **"Angel" Note:**

After Gabe's death I thought a lot about that wonderful Orthopedic Surgeon who had only seen Gabe that one day, but knew exactly what to do. He handled Gabe, Michelle, and I with such Angelic care. He was truly an Angel in our minds. In October 2007, I was participating in a Christian Men's Retreat called The Great Banquet. I was on a team of spiritual leaders and laymen who work to help about forty men develop a closer relationship to God. I was an assistant table leader with four retreat guests an a table leader. One of the guests at my table had mentioned that he was an orthopedic surgeon.

I quickly jumped to tell him the story of our orthopedic doctor at Riley Hospital who was such an Angel to Gabe, Michelle and me. I had explained that we had seen him only once that initial day and spent the following two years overwhelmed with hundreds of other doctors and medical staff. I would not remember his name or even what he looked like. I just remembered how much I cared for this man.

Later that day, while we were silently praying in the church chapel, something told me to open my eyes and look. There sat the orthopedic doctor who was a guest at my table. I said, "It was you; you were my son's doctor that life changing day in 2003? He smiled back at me and said in his soft, modest manner, "Yes, Scott– I remember Gabe well"! God loves me so much that he put Dr. Daniel Wurtz, back into my life that day'. Some may call that was a mere coincidence, but all the men at our table that day knew God was at work.


