The children that will receive the gifts may be in foster homes, group homes or with relatives. They are now in a difficult situation through no fault of their own.

We can help make a difference in the life of these children and make this a great Christmas. Simply bring new, unwrapped toys appropriate for ages 0 to 11 years old to the church. Sara Circle will provide containers to place the toys. A Guardian ad Litem program volunteer will pick up our donations during the week of December 15, wrap them and deliver them to the families.

Hospitality Committee's Cranberry Chutney

1-12oz package of fresh cranberries

2 pears cut in 1/3" cubes

3 oz package candied lemon peel

1 3/4 cup granulated sugar

1. Wash pears and cut in cubes the size of the cranberries

2. Place in a pot with all of the ingredients

3. Slowly bring to a boil, reduce and simmer for 15 minutes.

This chutney is also good with pork and wild game. Make a double batch, it will last several weeks in the refrigerator. Actually no it wont, it will be eaten up! Can be made ahead of time and is a great gift to take if you are going to a friends house for dinner.

Grace has asked our church to participate in this “Living Christmas Card”

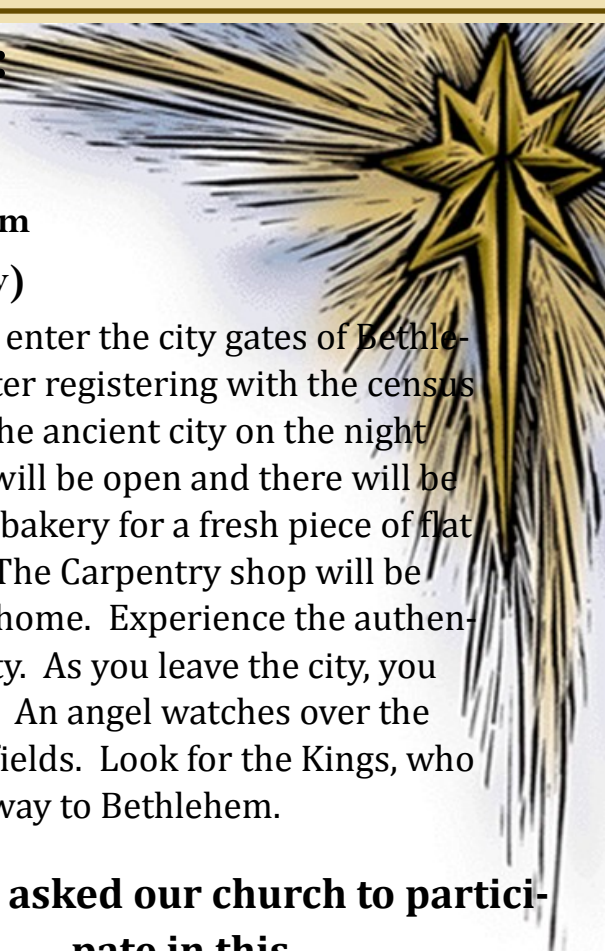
The church has agreed to operate the Pottery Shop creating the things needed in a Bethlehem home.

Advent: Pondering God's Love and Word in Life

"...Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart." (Luke 2)

To ponder: to consider; to muse; to brood over; to think about something carefully over a period of time; to wonder about; to mull-over a thing or notion.

When was the last time you paused and pondered something? Advent is a wonderful time to renew or to begin the spiritual practice of "pondering." Advent invites us to intentionally un-busy ourselves

and slow-down the pace of life. It encourages us through signs and words and silence to deliberately look for and listen to what God is busy with in the world around us.

As trees and lights and Santa and snowmen begin to appear on lawns and living rooms and in store front windows, the wonder of Christmas starts to show through. Well, at least one version of Christmas, anyway. I found that I became a little annoyed again this year as those signs of the season seemed to appear even earlier than last year, almost eclipsing the celebration of Thanksgiving. The retailers moved us right from Halloween (a holiday I wouldn't mind skipping anymore) to Christmas. Hum....no time or need for thanks? What does that say to us? Thanksgiving doesn't make much of a "showing" as it is crowded out by the early arrival of the (politically correct) "Happy Holiday" season. Okay, give thanks. But do it quickly. Christmas is in a hurry this year.

Did you notice how some stores had their after-Thanksgiving sales before we even sat down to eat our turkey and pumpkin pie? They had special sales the morning of Thanksgiving so we would be enticed to come early; to save time and get those Christmas bargains before we even start stuffing our turkeys. The bonus offered was that we'd avoid the hassle of "Black Friday" shopping. Now wait a minute. When did remembering each other, expressing our love, and giving gifts become a hassle? I wonder, will after-Christmas sales get pushed forward too? Will it be business as usual on Christmas day? Hum...we could ponder on this awhile too.

As disciples, we have better things to ponder and wonder about don't we? Remember that "good news of great joy for all the people" that the angel of the Lord shared with those frightened shepherds? Now there's something worth marking on our calendar for consideration. Of course, we have a lot which can distract us from this sacred practice of pondering the good news: long shopping lists, one too many parties to host or attend, extra hours of cooking and cleaning, trips to the post office where we stand impatiently in line, and stacks of packages to wrap and boxes of cards to address. These aren't un-Christian things to be busy with. But, they can distract us from the real gifts and meaning of the Christmas season if they become all-inclusive of our waking hours and our nighttime dreams.

We all could benefit from some divine intervention into our waking and sleeping hours about this time in our lives. Let's start looking for and expecting "angels and messengers" in our midst who will give us direction and news to share with each other. Pondering will help us to keep it all in perspective: to be more thankful; to see the wonder in the ordinary and routine; to hear holy words spoken; to see the unimaginable taking place among us; to be awed

by the sacred in one another; to be bearers of good news and great joy to the world; to love each other. Let's ponder these things.

One of my favorite Christmas texts to mull-over is Luke's account of Mary's "pondering." In the exhaustion and the jubilation of journeying and child-birth, she takes time to ponder. Mary ponders the words of shepherds and strangers as they come calling on the new born Jesus. She listens to them tell their amazing story of bright lights and a multitude of praise-filled angels in the dead silence of night. This is something she wants to remember forever. Something she would want to tell Jesus about when he grows older. She knows this is God's love made real and visible. But why? Why her? Why now? She ponders.

Joseph and Mary have walked a long road to Bethlehem to get to where they now find themselves. And Mary wasn't in a hurry to leave it all behind. It would be the beginning of a life-time journey with God in their midst. I imagine both of them pondered much in their hearts with each step they took and each wonder and word they encountered. In Advent, we too, are invited to walk this wonder and Word filled road to Bethlehem. We have a friend and a savior who walks with us as we take deliberate steps in prayer and worship and in our daily reading of the Bible. We too, are to ponder as we work for and serve God's kingdom day to day. Be present with God and full of expectation. Consider the blessings of today and be in no hurry to leave behind the sights and sounds of the season; of Emmanuel -of God with us. Pondering will slow your pace and even-out your breathing.

Let it give you the time and energy and clarity to focus on: why the good news is good news; why now; why us. Don't let Advent hurry-by in the busyness of the season. Celebrate it. Like the Shepherds, seek Christ. Give thanks. Glorify and praise God for what we have seen and been told. Ponder. Pray. Treasure all these things in your heart.

May your pondering begin with these age old words: "Come, Oh Come, Emmanuel." May great joy fill your journey to Bethlehem and beyond. Glory to God in the highest heaven and on earth peace...Christ's way of peace...to all God's children, I pray. Amen.

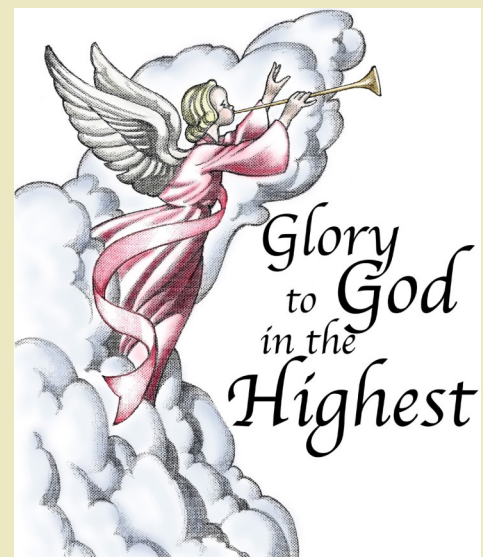
