
## **Focusing on the Trinity**

Christians are monotheists, meaning we believe in only one God. Yet we talk about the doctrine of the Trinity. In the church year, the Sunday after Pentecost is known as Trinity Sunday. It's a day for focusing on what theologians call the Triune God—the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

Someone said about the concept of the Trinity, "You will lose your soul if you don't believe it, and you will lose your mind if you try to explain it."

The bottom line is this: God (one Person) has been revealed to mankind in three ways. He is our Creator, who then came to Earth as our Savior (in the person of Jesus) and is eternally present with us as the Holy Spirit.

On Trinity Sunday, we praise our Triune God for meeting all our needs.

#### A Word from Pastor Michael

I think all of us who have gone to church throughout our life would say that we enjoy reading and hearing the word of God which we know as the "Bible." Our understanding and interpretation of the bible may vary, but God's word gives us meaning, guidance, and purpose.



Have you ever read or heard a bible passage or

story and wondered what it is saying and what it is saying to me? If you have then you are not alone. I think when we run across a passage like this, it raises our curiosity and raises awareness to either seek an answer or maybe even to ask questions of the pastor or someone whom we might know that is better versed on the bible so we might have clarity. I also feel that this is God's way to grab our attention so, we can grow in faith and understanding of his divine will for us. The Bible tells us this, "For my thoughts are not your thoughts neither are your ways my ways," declares the LORD. Isaiah 55:8-9.

So, I would like to share two strange bible stories with you, As you read them, here are some questions for you to think about and what God might be saying to you.

- · What strange thing did God use to grab the person's attention?
- · Why do you think God uses it?
- · Who was it speaking to?
- · What did God want the person to see or to do?
- · How is God speaking to you in this story?

The first story: In the Book of Numbers, a prophet named Balaam is on the road when his donkey stops three times. Each time, Balaam beats the donkey in an effort to get it moving. Apparently, God has given the donkey the ability to speak and it says: "What have I done to you to make you beat me these three times?" she says to Balaam, Numbers 22:28.

Balaam, who does not appear to be surprised that his donkey is talking to him, replies, "You have made a fool of me! If only I had a sword in my hand, I would kill you right now." The donkey replies, "Am I not your own donkey, which you have always ridden, to this day? Have I been in the habit of doing this to you?" Numbers 22:30.

#### The second story:

Now Moses was tending the flock of Jethro his father-in-law, the priest of Midian, and he led the flock to the far side of the wilderness and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. 2 There the angel of the LORD appeared to him in flames of fire from within a bush. Moses saw that though the bush was on fire it did not burn up. 3 So Moses thought, "I will go over and see this strange sight—why the bush does not burn up."

4 When the LORD saw that he had gone over to look, God called to him from within the bush, "Moses! Moses!" And Moses said, "Here I am."

5 "Do not come any closer," God said. "Take off your sandals, for the place where you are standing is holy ground." Exodus 3:1-5

Once again, remember the questions and allow God to grab your attention through these stories, and then ask yourself, how is God speaking to me?


