# Hymn for a summer day

Maltbie Davenport Babcock, a minister in upstate New York at the turn of the 20th century, often walked near Niagara Falls to enjoy the view of Lake Ontario and the surrounding scenery. He'd tell his wife he was "going to see the Father's world."

After Babcock's death in 1901, his wife, Katherine, published a book of his writings, including the 16-verse poem "My Father's World." Franklin Sheppard set it to music in 1915, using two verses of text for each hymn stanza.

This is my Father's world, and to my listening ears all nature sings, and round me rings the music of the spheres. This is my Father's world: I rest me in the thought of rocks and trees, of skies and seas; his hand the wonders wrought.

# A New Vision- Revitalizing as we follow God's call into the world.

"I was hungry and you fed me, I was thirsty and you gave me a drink, I was homeless and you gave me a room, I was shivering and you gave me clothes, I was sick and you stopped to visit, I was in prison and you came to me...I'm telling the solemn truth: Whenever you did one of these things to someone overlooked or ignored, that was me—you did it to me." (Matt. 25, The Message)

At our session retreat last month, a new vision statement for the church was discerned and adopted. Our new Vision Statement is: "Transforming Lives by the Love of Christ Jesus through Witness, Mission, and Evangelism." The Ruling Elders have each committed to be a visionary leader in a particular mission focus area for our church (Witness and Evangelism, Compassion, Care, Worship, Spiritual Development and Education, Building and Grounds, Stewardship). I have asked them to listen to and pray about this new Vision, form teams and committees to discern ministry plans of action, and start doing the ministry God is calling us to do. In the passage from Matthew's Gospel, Jesus has given us a very detailed and clear focus of where our actions must begin and where they will find fulfilment. This should guide our movement toward the Vision that always lies before us.

We also have our Mission Statement to guide our steps: "To be a place where the community can come together in Christ and provide, through God and his Word, love, comfort, and joy to all." There are opportunities everywhere to "come together," and to be "love, comfort, joy" to others beyond the walls of this church. In my experience, when we follow God's call into the world, this is where we experience renewal and revitalization. How we do this can be discovered as we seek answers to the question, "Where do you need us to join you, Jesus?" We do not have to look outside of our community, let alone some of the neighborhoods surrounding us, to find the hunger, thirst, homelessness, nakedness, and the imprisonment which Jesus expects us to do something about. If we look through the eyes of faith, we know each of these are physical as well as spiritual realities in the life of our community, neighbors, family, friends, and in ourselves.

As a missional church, our energy has to be used to reconnect ourselves with our community's needs and as partners with what is already being done for and by the people. If we want to see a future together as a renewed and revitalized growing church, we have to refocus our vision away from our own maintenance and preservation as a church. Otherwise, the question we have to answer is: what are we trying to preserve—God's vision or ours?

I believe that when we serve with vision, we will be energized in our witness, mission, and evangelism. We will have more than enough "energy" left over to care for ourselves and our church. That is one of the mysterious truths I have experienced over and over again in my journey with Jesus and thriving congregations.

#### God always fills the vessel that is emptying itself for others.

Another "truth" the Session and each of you need to hold on to is that the mission of the church is bigger than the membership. This allows us to faithfully dream God's dreams and see God's vision through a bigger picture than we might otherwise create ourselves. As we reach out, connect, and serve others through our witness, mission, and evangelism, each of you will be part of the mission of Christ through the Church.

**So, I'd like to hear what you think and want to say about our church and it's new Vision.** You are invited to meet with me on **Sunday, June 28**th **from 3-4:30p** at Gulftreat, to talk about what you see and hear through this new Vision and the ministries inspired in response to it. I want to hear your stories about the church, what inspires you, what you feel challenged by, and what you believe God may be calling us, calling you, to do now and in the future through ministries of Witness, Mission, and Evangelism.

Jesus calls us to discipleship in order to share the good news of God's love. Expect to meet Christ in one another. Expect to experience renewal. Watch our church be revitalized by the power of the Holy Spirit through our sharing of Witness, Mission, and Evangelism.

Let's take these words with us on the journey: May we now depart,

knowing the invitation of God

to move from comfort to insecurity—

so we may move from what we know to what we have yet to discover;

May we now follow,

knowing the invitation of Christ Jesus

to move from the safety of our own making to a place of risk for his kingdom—so we may move from where we have been to where we have yet to go;

May we now listen,

knowing the invitation of the Holy Spirit

to move us from self to selflessness—

so we may move from how we once knew God to how we have yet to discover who and where God is at work.

Be committed to sharing in the ministries of Witness, Mission, and Evangelism, through the invitation of Christ Jesus, our Lord and Savior, who made the invitation to, "Follow me," without saying where he was going. His promise to you on such a journey is transformation and a deepening relationship with the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Pray and ask, "Where do you need us to join you, Jesus?"

Report from Food Pantry—April 2015 our food pantry served 145 people a total of 1305 meals.

The Pantry is very, very low on the hygiene and cleaning products at this time. The Pantry Policy has been to buy nutritious foods only.

So we are asking for your donations of the following: shampoo, razors, deodorant, liquid dish soap, toilet paper, paper towels, can openers. I recommend you purchase small travel size or sample sizes of the hygiene products. We break down packages with multiple items and distribute just one at a time, i.e. one roll of toilet paper per client, etc.

I have begun shopping at Dollar Tree for Pantry food. I've noticed good buys on hygiene and cleaning products there as well. It sure helps stretch that dollar. My plea to the congregations is to search your heart and if you can help us with these non-nutritious products for a few months that would be wonderful.

#### Treasurer's Report

- For the month ending March 31, 2015 GBPC recorded a net loss of \$2,820. The total income was \$15,867; \$12,700 regular givers, \$1,490 loose plate, \$1,400 in rental income, miscellaneous income \$40, interest income \$.56 and in-kind contributions of \$277. The general operating expense was \$8,788. The payroll expense was \$9,560. In the month of March, the long term debt of GBPC was reduced by \$3,646, leaving a mortgage balance of \$466,113. For the 1st Quarter of 2015: income was \$55,615, operating expenses were \$25,368, and payroll expenses were \$27,000. 1st Quarter net income was \$2,250.
- Session approved to move the money from designated fund 425.03, flowers, to unrestricted funds.

#### **Member Care:**

- The committee has begun a new ministry to support caregivers. This ministry is open to the community and will begin April 27, 2015 at 1pm in Gulftreat. It will take place weekly.
- Pot luck lunches and they will be offered the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of each month May October in Gulftreat family center.

#### Mission

March 2015 our food pantry served 122 people a total of 1100 meals. We received cash donations of \$565 while we purchased \$55 in groceries.

#### **Evangelism:**

• The Shepherding Committee continues to meet the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of each month. The team is visiting and contacting those in need.

#### **Old Business**

The Session will meet with our Realtor on April 30, 2015 at 5:30 to discuss the options for listing our property .
