

Stewardship Minute

What is the Question?

If money is the answer for everything, what is the question?

Money, we know, cannot ensure health, happiness or immortality. It cannot buy peace of conscience or loving relationships. Yet it is not to be despised. Money supplies a thousand advantages. It can support our churches, a Christian college, send a missionary to Africa, supply Bibles for China or buy cooling fans for poor people in the city.

It is not money that is "a root of all kinds of evil," but the love of money (1 Timothy 6:10). Jesus condemns money when it becomes an object of devotion equal to God (Matthew 6:24). In his parable of the ten minas (Luke 19:11-26), the third servant who laid his money away in a piece of cloth was punished because he didn't put his money to work. He didn't even invest it so it could earn a little interest.

God is the ultimate supplier of all wealth. He puts us in a position where we have money either by giving us employment, an inheritance, wise investments or other means. No matter how we got what money we have, God enabled us to have it. Therefore, he has a right to say what we do with the money he gave us.

The question is, "what is my most versatile possession?" The answer is money. God's guidelines to those who possess it are amazingly simple:

1 Timothy 6:18 *Command them to do good, to be rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share.*

2 Corinthians 9:6-8 6 Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. 7 Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. 8 And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work.

Luke 21: 1-4 21 As Jesus looked up, he saw the rich putting their gifts into the temple treasury. 2 He also saw a poor widow put in two very small copper coins. 3 "Truly I tell you," he said, "this poor widow has put in more than all the others. 4 All these people gave their gifts out of their wealth; but she out of her poverty put in all she had to live on."
