A Word from Pastor Michael

Romans 12:2 say these wonderful words, *Do not* conform to the pattern of this world but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing, and perfect will. NIV

Being a Christian is a joy and a challenge at times. We are called to be faithful and a lot of times our faith can be put to the test. Keeping those thoughts in mind, our mindset plays an important role as Christians and in our church's growth. It is easy for people to say, "Have faith or keep the faith." When we are faced with situations in life, we can lose our faith and focus. I was reading a couple of stories about people and through their perseverance, they went on to achieve fame and greatness in life. The first-person story I will share briefly is, about famed basketball star and businessman Michael Jordon.

Michael Jordan famously said: "I've missed more than 9,000 shots in my career. I've lost almost 300 games. Twenty-six times, I've been trusted to take the game-winning shot and missed. I've failed over and over and over again in my life. And that is why I succeed."

The next story is about Abraham Lincoln: Abraham Lincoln Didn't Quit

Born into poverty, Lincoln was faced with defeat throughout his life. He lost eight elections, twice failed in business, and suffered a nervous breakdown.

Lincoln was a champion, and he never gave up. Here is a sketch of Lincoln's road to the White House:

 \cdot 1816: His family was forced out of their home. He had to work to support them.

- · 1818: His mother died.
- · 1831: Failed in business.
- · 1832: Ran for state legislature lost.

 \cdot 1832: Also lost his job - wanted to go to law school but couldn't get in.

 \cdot 1833: Borrowed some money from a friend to begin a business and by the end of the year he was bankrupt. He spent the next 17 years of his life paying off this debt.

· 1834: Ran for state legislature again - won.

 \cdot 1835: Was engaged to be married, his sweetheart died and his \cdot

·1843: Ran for Congress - lost.

 \cdot 1846: Ran for Congress again - this time he won - went to Washington and did a good job.

· 1848: Ran for re-election to Congress - lost.

1849 Sought the job of land officer in his home state - rejected.

1854: Ran for Senate of the United States - lost.

 \cdot 1856: Sought the Vice-Presidential nomination at his party's national convention - got less than 100 votes.

· 1858: Ran for U.S. Senate again - again he lost.

· 1860: Elected president of the United States.

It is with faith and having the right mindset we can achieve in life and do the will of God in such a way that others will take note and want to know what the secret to our success was. Will it be easy? Probably not! However, God gives us examples like Michael Jordon & Abraham Lincoln and places gems and pearls of wisdom throughout the bible. Can't pray? First rest!

Weariness can seriously hamper our attempts to pray, says Bonnie Gray, author of *Whispers of Rest.* "We are a generation who doesn't know how to express our souls to God, even though we drive ourselves exhausted, doing for Jesus." The solution, she says, is to stop and rest.

The stressed-out, despairing prophet in 1 Kings 19 is a prime example. "God knew Elijah needed physical rejuvenation first — in order to hear his gentle voice, whispering in a gentle breeze," Gray notes. Guarding against the depletion of spiritual, physical and emotional resources can improve our ability to

hear God's voice, too. "When you find it's hard to pray, don't be afraid," says Gray. "You're standing at the very cusp of who God longs to connect with. The real you. Take the time to rest. You're worth it."
